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# MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

Thank you for taking the time to find out more about the vacancy we are currently advertising and for considering joining our community. Our website will tell you about the school, but this document is designed to tell you what it is like to work at Southville, and more about the role and how to apply.

We are a three form entry primary school, Nursery to Y6. We amalgamated Southville Infant and Nursery School and Southville Junior School in September 2018. Bringing two groups of staff together was a positive and exciting experience and we have a happy, supportive and nurturing staff of over 90 colleagues in total. Our school is popular with parents and oversubscribed in many year groups. Ofsted acknowledged the rapid journey that we had been on in January 2023, and we received an overall judgment of 'Good' in all areas.

I have worked at Southville for over 30 years – first as an NQT (now ECT!), then Year Leader, Deputy Head and then Head teacher of Southville Infant School. I was appointed as Head Teacher of the primary school prior to us amalgamating. I love the vibrant, diverse Feltham community and I love working in a school where every day brings new challenges but also things to celebrate. The leadership team is made up of leaders from both the previous infant and junior school, all with different strengths, areas of expertise and experiences, and who are well respected and established in our school and community. We all share the same passion for combining the best education that we can possibly provide, with exceptional nurture and pastoral care. In response to the complex needs of our community, we are a trauma informed school, and are passionate about supporting children who suffer with trauma or mental health difficulties and whose distressed behaviour acts as a barrier to learning.

Our motto is 'Learning Today for the World of Tomorrow '- this genuinely informs everything we do, from our curriculum, the values and qualities that we endeavor to instill, and the behaviours that we promote. Our school values are Respect, Responsibility, Resilience, Compassion, Integrity and Happiness which we strive to model for our pupils in our everyday work and interactions.

We endeavor to recruit staff who share our passions and values. We look for self-motivated staff who want and expect to work hard and make a positive contribution, in a school where staff are treated with respect and kindness. If our values align with yours, and our vacancy matches your skill set, we would be delighted to hear from you. Visits to our school are welcomed and encouraged - either in or out of school hours. We look forward to meeting you.

# WORKLOAD AND WELLBEING

We do all we can to ensure workload is manageable and prioritise the wellbeing of our staff.

- Our live marking policy means formal marking expectations for teachers are minimal.

- We have a high level of additional support, with TAs assigned to every class.

I appreciate the support from other staff, support from SLT, the consistent approach towards behaviour, high levels of pastoral care, the ability to leave early as needed and to choose whether to work more at home after school, for example. The flexibility is very helpful because the days can be full-on in the classroom. I also appreciate that adults in the school work as a team and all adults seem to know each family/child, which really helps. There is a genuine sense of care and camaraderie within the school environment.

My first day at Southville Primary School was as a supply teacher. The children were so friendly, as were the staff, who made me feel so welcome and part of the team on that very first day. Although the behaviour of some children was challenging at times, it has been so rewarding watching them develop, mature and form trusting relationships which support their learning process. They use the strategies at the school to help regulate themselves and follow the school rules; be ready, be respectful, be safe. I worked as part of an extremely supportive year group team as well as part of a wider whole school team which is often referred to as the Southville Family. The teachers and support staff at this school work tirelessly to support the various social, emotional, behavioural and academic needs of the children. Although I am leaving to join a school closer to my home, I have enjoyed my short time at Southville, have been proud to work here and will leave with great memories.

Having worked at Southville for almost a decade, I can honestly say it is a fantastic place to work and build a career in teaching. I began my career here as an NQT and like so many early careers teachers I have seen come after me, I felt nurtured, guided and respected during the early years of my career. As a new teacher, you feel supported and empowered to move onto the next stage of your career. When speaking to the children, we often talk about the "Southville values" or our school motto - and at this school, these aren't just words on a poster for window dressing - but ideals that are the foundation of everything we do. Children are taught here to be ready for the "world of tomorrow" in all ways - not just in the tireless push for academic success to give our children the opportunities they deserve - but also in preparing our children emotionally and mentally for the challenges of life. Our staff are given a huge amount of CPD and training on the importance of having an emotionally regulated classroom. The outlook of Southville staff is that the emotional wellbeing of children is paramount to their success and happiness - and this mind-set is embedded within the school from support staff to senior leaders. Having been a staff member during the amalgamation, it is amazing to see how effectively "starting a school from scratch" has allowed the leadership to build a school with such an authentic and effectively realised vision of what they want our school to be.

Our cohort of children are incredibly dynamic, engaging and likeable but they do come with a unique set of challenges - and our school has been tireless in creating a world in which those challenges are best supported and children are built for the future. The ethos among the staff is sensational and one of the school's strongest attributes: Staff genuinely support each other, look out for each other and uplift each other at all times - within classrooms, year groups, phases and the school as a whole, people work as a unit and team to create the best environment for the children to learn and thrive whilst also ensuring that staff are looked after and supported. The social aspect of the school is fantastic and new staff are welcomed into the fold warmly! The senior leadership at the school are superb: they are approachable, understanding and lead by example - helping to make this a fantastic place to work along with all of the other teachers, LSAs and Admin & support staff.
